

Joel R. Reidenberg holds the Stanley D. and Nikki Waxberg Chair in Law and is the Founding Academic Director of the Center on Law and Information Policy at Fordham Law School. He is a former Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs and Associate Chief Academic Officer of Fordham University and a former President of the University's Faculty Senate. Reidenberg's published books and articles explore both information privacy and information technology law and policy. He teaches courses in Intellectual Property Law, Internet Law and Information Privacy. He has served as an expert adviser to the U.S. Congress, the Federal Trade Commission and the European Commission. He has also chaired the Section on Defamation and Privacy of the Association of American Law Schools (the academic society for American law professors) and is a former chair of the association's Section on Law and Computers.

Reidenberg received an A.B. degree from Dartmouth College, a J.D. from Columbia University, and both a D.E.A. droit international économique and a Ph.D in law from the Université de Paris -Sorbonne. He is admitted to the Bars of New York and the District of Columbia.
