

## **Albert Tramposch**

Administrator for Policy and External Affairs

Albert Tramposch is the Administrator for Policy and External Affairs at the USPTO. In that position, Mr. Tramposch serves as a policy advisor to Under Secretary of Commerce for Intellectual Property and oversees administration and support for all domestic and international IP policy-related operations; congressional and legislative engagement, as carried out by the Office of Governmental Affairs; education and training, as carried out under the Global Intellectual Property Academy (GIPA); global IP leadership through administration of the IP Attaché Program; and economic analysis, as carried out by the Chief Economist.

Prior to joining the USPTO, Mr. Tramposch served as Deputy Executive Director -- International and Regulatory, at the American Intellectual Property Law Association (AIPLA), a 16,000-member Association of IP practitioners and owners in the United States. He earlier served as Director of Industrial Property Law at the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) in Geneva, where he headed the WIPO team for the Diplomatic Conference for the Adoption of the Patent Law Treaty in 2000, and was responsible, inter alia, for the Standing Committee on Trademarks, the Standing Committee on Patents, and the Advisory Committee on Enforcement.

Mr. Tramposch is a registered patent attorney in the United States. In addition to private practice of intellectual property law, he administered programs in IP at George Mason University School of Law and John Marshall Law School, and served as law clerk to the Honorable Pauline Newman, U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit. Recently, he acted as consultant to the Presidency of the European Union on matters relating to intellectual property and global challenges.

Mr. Tramposch received an A.B. from Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore, MD, and a J.D. from the University of Washington in Seattle, WA.
