

Dr. Ying DU is currently a visiting scholar at Columbia law school, while in China she is a professor of law at Huazhong University of Science & Technology (HUST) Law School (Wuhan). Before joining HUST in 2008, Professor DU was a professor of law at China Central Party School (Beijing) specializing in intellectual property law. The current focus of her teaching and scholarship is in the field of trademark law. She had been conducting research in USA (Yale Law School, Columbia Law School), UK (Nottingham University Law School Human Rights Law Center) and Japan (Niigata University Law School). She has published more than 40 articles in core law journals of China, authored one trademark textbook (Peking University Press, 2010), co-authored 2 intellectual property textbooks (2007, 2008). She has written and published one monograph entitled *Electronic Contracts* (Hunan University Press, 2001), and the second monograph entitled *The Evolution of the Trademark Regime in the Context of the Social Development* is forthcoming in August 2011 ( Peking University Press) . Her Chinese translations of US Patent Law, US Copyright Law and US Trademark Law will be published in July 2011 (Intellectual Property Press of P.R. China). Besides teaching, she is also the counselor for a big Chinese publishing group.
