

Mr. James Love is the Director of Knowledge Ecology International (KEI). Mr. Love is also the U.S. co-chair of the Trans-Atlantic Consumer Dialogue (TACD) Intellectual Property Policy Committee, and the chair of the Essential Inventions board of directors. He advises UN agencies, national governments, international and regional intergovernmental organizations and public health NGOs, and is the author of a number of articles and monographs on innovation and intellectual property rights.

In 2006, Knowledge Ecology International received a MacArthur Award for Creative and Effective Institutions. In 2013, Mr. Love received the Electronic Frontier Foundation's Pioneer Award, to recognize leaders who extend freedom and innovation in the realm of information technology. His work on bringing down the price of AIDS/HIV treatments for people in the developing world is featured in the documentary, *Fire in the Blood*.

Knowledge Ecology International was created in 2006 as a separate entity to carry out work earlier done through the Center for Study of Responsive Law and Essential Information. Mr. Love was employed by the Center for Study of Responsive Law from 1990 to 2006. Mr. Love was previously Senior Economist for the Frank Russell Company, a lecturer at Rutgers University, and a researcher on international finance at Princeton University.

Mr. Love holds a Masters of Public Administration from Harvard University's Kennedy School of Government and a Masters in Public Affairs from Princeton's Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs.
