

## **Norman Siebrasse**

Norman Siebrasse is a Professor of Law at the University of New Brunswick, Canada. He received his BSc in Engineering Physics and his LLB from Queen's University, Canada, before clerking at the Supreme Court of Canada for the Honourable Madam Justice McLachlin during the 1991-1992 term. After receiving an LLM from the University of Chicago, he joined the University of New Brunswick Faculty of Law in 1993, where he teaches Intellectual Property Law, Competition Law, Commercial Law and Remedies. His research and writing focuses on patent law, in particular pharmaceutical patent law, patent remedies and the intersection of IP law and commercial law. His writing, including his blog, is regularly cited by the Canadian courts.
